DO'S & DON'TS, HOW TO AND OTHER TIPS

Do's

- ✓ Select Single Topic
- ✓ Submit 60 to 90-Second Video

Don'ts

- ✗ Use Watermarks or Product Brands
- ✗ Use Copyrighted Materials

SINGLE TOPIC: The submission must acknowledge a single (1) overarching application and provide a full and concise response to how drones could be used for good.

VIDEO DURATION: Videos must be more than 30 seconds but not longer than 90 seconds.

OFFICIAL RULES: Make sure to review the official rules to ensure you are meeting all entry requirements and deadlines. Brand products are not allowed as part of the video setting, props or background.

WATERMARKS & BRANDING: The submission must be free of all watermarks, third-party logos, or non-PCS Edventures marketing.

COPYRIGHT MATERIALS: No copyrighted materials may be used unless sourced from public commons or you are given explicit permission in writing for its use.

Windows OS

Current versions of Windows 10: Find the **Photos** app in your Start Bar and click the "New Video" button.

Previous versions of Windows: Search your Start Bar for the **Movie Maker** application.

Apple OS

Mac and IOS devices are compatible with **iMovie**, a video editing software available from Apple. If your device does not have iMovie downloaded, navigate to the Apple webpage to download the application.



If you are unable to utilize either of these options, there are free versions of video editing software available online. Be cautious, however, as most of these applications will apply watermarks or logos to your video. Any video submissions with these watermarks, logos or third-party marketing will be automatically disqualified from the contest.
